"Personal Accountability"

Knowing how to create and sustain a culture of accountability is a challenge in most non-profit organizations so this session looks at the necessary first step – acknowledging the need for personal accountability. We will define personal accountability while identifying the shift that is required for results- to move from the traditional to the alternative view. The Question Behind the Question (QBQ) method will be shared and encouraged for more accountability with future leadership choices, questions, and behaviors. This method focuses on how to change your questions to be more effective and therefore rid us of the procrastination, excuses, and blame game we have a tendency to go to instead of taking appropriate responsibility. Three guiding principles to accountability leadership will end the session with discussion, interactive activities, and group work throughout the session.
